Living with Lovegrass

‘Living with Lovegrass’ a forum designed around learning from each other on how to manage African Lovegrass was held at the Namadgi Visitor Centre on Saturday 22nd May.

Around sixty people attended the forum and it was interesting to hear the range of views expressed about lovegrass. Some graziers expressed the view that lovegrass is here, cattle can use it, so perhaps we are better off devoting resources to Serrated Tussock. Others thought that lovegrass is potentially our worst environmental and agricultural weed species. Whatever the view there is no denying African lovegrass is a highly persistent, summer growing, perennial grass weed that is invading rural properties, urban parklands and roadsides and nature reserves across our region.

When the write-up of the forum is completed I will let you know that it is on our website. Anna Van Dugteren, Esther Duffy, Geoff Hyles, myself and potentially David Shorthouse will meet to discuss how we can promote recommendations out of the forum.

2010-2011 ACT Environment Grants

The ACT Environment Grants provides financial assistance to community-based, 'not-for-profit' environmental projects in the ACT. Applications closed 30 May. Southern ACT Catchment Group has applied for funds to assist weed control throughout the ACT. This project will provide strategic assistance for the control of weed species as part of integrated pest management in the ACT. The project will enhance the weed control resources and training available to land managers and associated groups by the provision of a trailer mounted spray unit and appropriate training.

SACTCG is sponsoring *'Brindabella Banding'* - a long term bird banding site revisited: Monitoring post-fire changes to the bird and small mammal fauna of the Brindabella Ranges; survival, composition and migration in a changing climate.

We have supplied a letter of support for the Conservation Council ACT Region Inc. for the project *'Expansion of the Bush-on-the Boundary (BoB) Groups Network'* which is looking to establish new BoB groups centred around Jerrabomberra-Eastlake and the Tuggeranong Valley (Murrumbidgee Corridor), based upon the model of the successful operation of BoB Gungahlin.

We have supplied a letter of support for the working group of the Tidbinbilla VIP program run by Conservation Volunteers Australia to produce the book *Tidbinbilla A to Z*. The CVA publication will be a 32 page book with each letter of the alphabet indicating something at Tidbinbilla beginning with that letter, eg: 'A' = 'Ants'. The 'children's book will have a short written text illustrated by a high quality engaging photograph taken at Tidbinbilla by volunteers and staff involved with the Volunteer Interpreter Program.

The Murrumbidgee Catchment Management Authority (MCMA) has announced the opening of ‘The Bidgee from Behind the Lens’ photographic competition to celebrate the Murrumbidgee catchment’s natural assets. The Murrumbidgee catchment has one of the most diverse climates in NSW – from alpine areas of Kosciuszko National Park, through to the rich grazing belts of the South-West Slopes and grasslands of the semi-arid western Riverina. The MCMA would like to capture the diversity, beauty and sustainable management of the Murrumbidgee catchment and invites entries that may include, but are not limited to, images of wildlife, flora, landscapes, wetlands and rivers, sustainable farming practices and communities living in and caring for the catchment.

There are four categories – Primary Student; Secondary Student; Open Amateur; and Open Professional. Photographs can be historic or recent, black and white or colour – but they must be from the Murrumbidgee catchment. Only digital entries will be accepted.
