It is my pleasure to wish you all a very merry festive season! It has been a difficult year to be a 'Waterwatcher' with so many of our beloved waterways becoming dry or showing significant signs of stress from little rain. That huge areas of NSW are suffering bushfires will also sit uneasily with many. A significant number of our volunteers began their involvement in Waterwatch with the 'C.A.M.P.F.I.R.E' program. In 2003 a fire storm destroyed most of the A.C. T's beautiful bushland in addition to hundreds of homes and several lives. Waterwatch was viewed as a perfect way for a traumatised community to help with the recovery of the 'bush capital'. C.A.M.P.F.I.R.E. stood for **C**ommunities **A**ssessing and **M**onitoring **P**rogress of a **F**ire **I**mpacted **E**nvironment. The annual **C**atchment **H**ealth **I**ndicator **P**rogram (C.H.I.P) reports replaced the 4 years of C.A.M.P.F.I.R.E. reporting that gathered Waterwatch data after 'the fires'. These annual reports, which began 10 years later in 2013, have since grown to become an enviable model of citizen science in action. Collating your data and writing this year's report will not be a happy business. I am glad that you continued to visit your sites and record what you can. Lesser folk would have walked away from such a task.

Below is a summary of water releases from Icon Water dams in the Southern ACT, courtesy of Chris Martin, Icon Water.

Bendora

Currently not overflowing.

Current release via scour valve is approximately 30 MLD

Due to low inflows, the releases have been reduced to calculated natural flow as per the licence:

11 Dec 10.1 – 11.5 MLD 0.83 – 0.84 m

18 Dec 29.9 – 32.9 MLD 0.92- 0.93 m

Licence requirements:

11 Dec 51.3 MLD

18 Dec 30.8 MLD

Corin

Currently not overflowing.

Current release via cone valve is approximately 12 MLD.

12 Dec 9.93 – 11.1 MLD 0.20 – 0.21 m

19 Dec 12.3-13.4 MLD 0.22-0.23 m

Licence requirements:

12 Dec 39 MLD

19 Dec 13 MLD

Cotter

Currently not overflowing.

Current flow 15 ML/d through Cotter Dam Cone Valve.

Licence release requirements:

Base release flow of >15 ML/d, with bi-monthly riffle release of >100 ML/d for >24 hours. ORFlow requirements as described in M2C section of the Water Abstraction EMP.
